## Restorative Practice

*“Restorative Practice is a values-based philosophy; it aims to consciously build relationships, respond to harm/conflict in a way that honours relationships, and CONNECT us to our best selves and to one another. The values of this philosophy promote relational ways of being, it informs how we think, engage, speak, listen, and approach situations, all day, every day” (M.Stowe [www.connectrp.ie](http://www.connectrp.ie)).*

The staff have been building on their previous professional development in this area. They are training in restorative practice working with Michelle Stowe and Connect RP. Recently staff have been trained in working and supporting children who have experienced trauma. Our Board of Management and Parents Association have received training as part of our school wide approach to working restoratively.

We encourage parents to engage with the videos to aid the school in developing a restorative approach across our whole school community.
